SUBJECT: BUDGET RECAP

At the last budget meeting, I presented an option that would bring the required general levy increase to 5.24%. After discussion from Council, the general consensus was to not use general reserves to the \$500,000 level given the future issues that Council will face next year. The recommendation was to only use \$300,000 which would bring the levy increase of approximately 6.45%. Since the last budget meeting, the Au Chateau has finalized their budget with a further reduction of \$46,332 from what was presented as draft to Council. This change has now reduced the general levy increase to **6.20%**.

The following is a breakdown of changes from the original 11.64% levy.

Given the reduction and changes highlighted above, the following are the material changes in operations that will now form part of the 2020 budget. I will not restate the rationale as this has already been discussed and a consensus reached.

Community Services

Added Sub Foreman to assist with increased demand.

Coordinator Community Services to deal with increased expectations

Contractors (small increase) 15k

Special projects (10k)

Added revenue for Committees

Increase to reserve

PW

Mechanic (will assist in all areas)
Increase to reserve fleet and equipment
Increase to capital.
Additional project mgmt. position (cemeteries, drains, capital)

Fire

Increase to reserve

I trust that the above provides a simple synopsis that all will understand. I understand that there have been further requests for information on PW capital based on last week's meeting. Shawn will be providing the report as a separate memo however the discussions (as staff were able to decipher), did not affect expenditure levels per se.

There seemed to be some variance among those staff who were present as to what was actually requested by a majority (5) of Council. I hope that we will have the proper information for you tomorrow.

RE: SIDEWALK OPTIONS (BUDGETARY ESTIMATES)

As per request from council on February 25th, 2020, the manager of Public Works has prepared budgetary costing for the construction of sidewalks on various Municipal roads. The various options provided include:

- Concrete sidewalks at a unit price of \$125/m²
- Asphalt sidewalk at a unit price of \$78/m²
- Asphalt Paved shoulder at a unit price of \$50/m²
- Paved shoulder in conjunction with resurfacing at a unit price of \$25/m²

As council was undecided on the Third street sidewalk priority, this budgetary cost could be provided at a later date.

I would also remind council that these are budgetary unit prices with some variables for specific sites. A stand alone sidewalk without curb, gutters and/or adequate drainage will likely result in premature failures and/or drainage problems which are often a none issue with paved shoulders/bike lanes. Other variables would include alignment conflicts, restoration, contract supervision, testing(QA/QC), etc...

In addition to the various sidewalk options, I have included the Safe Sidewalks Canada condition assessment data completed in late 2018. This data should be considered when prioritising sidewalk investments. I would again recommend council adopt a formal Sidewalk Policy reflective of our current sidewalk conditions. A written policy would provide staff (as well as our residents) with clear direction on sidewalk capital planning and expenditures.
